2.12. How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes:

Students were made to come to classes and required to put minimum of 75% of attendance to become eligible for writing end semester examinations. For this purpose open forums and other programmes periodically conducted. The outcome of this exercise is measured by maintaining of records of their performance in class rooms hourly attendance statement supplemented by biometric attendance. For every subject on an average 60 hours of teaching required as prescribed by curriculum design. By the use of time table (Hourly distributed workload of teachers) periodical (Monthly) reviews were conducted and progress of students evaluated. Only after this first and second internal assessment tests were conducted. Final end semester examinations were conducted only after conduct of 60 hours of teaching. The learning progress of students was evaluated in terms of internal assessment and every student of the class was given feed back of the teachers about weaknesses and strengths. They were properly advised where ever necessary to improve. At the end of the semester students feedback is collected and analysed. The inferences drawn in analysis are circulated to all the teachers.

The University has entered into memorandum of understanding (MoU) with different agencies to share their experiences, expertise and skills with our students to develop employability skills and attitudes. The agencies are;

- 1. MOU with Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT Bombay: MGU signed MOU, dated 16th September, 2015, with IIT Bombay for implementing the 'Spoken Tutorial Project', a project under National Mission on Education through ICT, MHRD, Government of India, in the University and its affiliated Colleges.
 - All the Campus Colleges have introduced the Courses under the Spoken Tutorial Project for their Students.
 - ii. All the Government Colleges affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University are implementing the courses since 2015-16 academic year.
 - iii. 33 Nodal Colleges are identified from the private degree colleges that are affiliated to MGU for implementing the Spoken Tutorial Programme from 2017-18 academic year.

- 2. MOU with Tally Education: An MOU is entered with 'Tally Education Private Limited' on 16th September, 2015, for empowering the students by imparting industry relevant skill and for increasing their employability. In collaboration with 'Tally Education' training is imparted for learning Tally package and placement assistance is also provided.
- 3. MOU with National Council of Rural Institutes (NCRI): An MOU is entered with National Council of Rural Institutes, Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India on 24th March, 2017. for 'Rural Engagement Programmes' are implemented for both Under Graduate and Post Graduate Courses of the Campus and Affiliated Colleges Students from the academic year 2017-18 onwards. The total Programme is spread across four Semesters. The students enrolled for this Programme have to visit a select village / rural area, at least for 15 days, for observing the rural activity. He / She has to document the observations, which will be called as Observation Study. The student should also prepare a **Project Report** on the select topic (Rural based) and submit the dissertation. This Programme is an Add-on Course and has four Credits. A two day Workshop on 'Curriculum Development on Rural Community Engagement of Students' is organised by Mahatma Gandhi University with the collaboration of NCRI on 23rd and 24th of June, 2017. The Departments of Social Work, Economics, Commerce, Management Studies, Life Sciences, Chemistry and Geology have framed the Curriculum to be implemented from 2017-18 academic years onwards. This will be an Add-on Course for which Additional Credits are given.

This Programme is implemented with an objective of contextualizing the Rural Issues and Challenges and the suitable responses to them and to integrate the same in the teaching and learning.

4. MOU with IYF: An MOU is entered into 'International Youth Fellowship' for imparting 'Mind Education' to the students of MGU. IYF is an International organization working for the Youth Empowerment with its Head Quarters at South Korea, is an NGO nurturing the next generation leaders of the world. An Open Elective Paper on 'Mind Education' (for UG & PG Courses) and 'Cross Cultural Leadership' (for MBA Travel and Tourism Course) are introduced this academic year i.e., 2017-18.

- **5. SWAYAM, MOOCS:** SWAYAM (Study Web of Active Learning by Young and Aspring Minds) is the Indian online learning platform. MOOCS (Massive open online courses) are the courses offered on the SWAYAM platform. MGU is implementing these courses for the benefit of its students from the academic year 2017-18.
- **6. SWAYAM Prabha:** The SWAYAM PRABHA is a project for telecasting high quality educational programmes through 32 DTH channels on 24X7 basis. Every day there will be new content of atleast (4) hours which would be repeated 6 times a day, allowing the students to choose the time of his/her convenience. The proposal of installation of 5 sets of Dish and Television (Monitor) at two hostels at Yellareddygudem Campus and one set at Panagal Campus is in the process.
- 7. National Digital Library (NDL): Our University is a registered member under the institutional category, with National Digital Library. For efficient usage of the eresources procurement of the Library software like d-space, high end server with UPS Back up facility are in process.
- **8. e-SHODH SINDHU:** Our University is a registered member, in the institutional Category, for e-Shodh Sindhu.
- **9. INFLIBNET:** MGU has registered for Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) of MHRD.
- **10. NMEICT, MHRD:** MGU has available bandwidth of 1 Gbps under the NMEICT, MHRD under the connectivity support programme.
- **11. VIRTUAL LABS:** The University is about to implement Virtual Labs to the students of University College of Science and Informatics and University College of Engineering and Technology Colleges.
- **12. NPTEL:** MGU is offering Under Graduate Courses in Engineering from the academic year 2013-14. Our University has taken a decision to implement elearning through online Web and Video courses in Engineering offered by The **National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning** (NPTEL), a project funded by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) from 2017-18 academic year.
- **13. MOU with Pottisriramulu Telugu University:** MGU has collaborated with Pottisriramulu Telugu University, Hyderabad, for starting Centre for Performing Arts at its main Campus. Telugu University will provide necessary academic

assistance through providing Subject Experts, necessary teaching material etc to MGU.

14. MOU with MSN Labs:Dr. M. Satyanarayana Reddy hails from small village called Gurukuntla from Mahabubnagar district. He has completed his M.Sc (Organic Chemistry) from Osmania University in 1982-84. He did his Ph.D under the guidance of Prof. Sriman Narayana from Osmania University. He started his carreer in the Dr. Reddy's Laboratories (Bollaram) as Group Leader. He grown up to Vice President and left the company in the year of 2003 to start MSN laboratories PVT. LTD.



Students told to stay focused on studies

24/7 engagement helps: VC of MGU

"Show me a student who achieved something by sloganeering, or by participating in congregations, they are only for politicians," Mahatama Gandhi University Vice Chancellor Altaf Khaja Hussain told his students here on Tuesday.

Instead, several students' problems could be solved by interacting with elders, he suggested. Speaking at the inaugural of a workshop on Research Methodology for students at the University, Professor Khaja Hussain said attendance and 24/7 engagement of students was the only formula for good results.

"Earlier governments did not impose such conditions, but this government is doing it with an aim to raise the standards of education," he said.

Telangana State Council of Higher Education Chairman T. Papi Reddy, who was

present, observed that the "collapsing state of education system was a result of the unethical practices – manipulating attendance, seats, and examinations by money – by private educational institutions."

Appreciating the University efforts in ensuring attendance, Professor Papi Reddy said MGU was the only one in the State that is strictly monitoring attendance of students and teachers.

Rural Community Engagement makes MGU stand apart

Biometric attendance compulsory for students and staff

Student community is always a good community, as they seek to learn new things, but should be aware of fringe sections, even among teachers, says Mahatma Gandhi University Vice-Chancellor Khaja Altaf Hussain.

In an interview with *The Hindu*, Prof. Altaf Hussain said he persuades his students and staff to achieve more by 'keeping themselves busy'.

Academic excellence as the motto, the Mahatma Gandhi University at Nalgonda was established in 2007. Presently there are 140 colleges affiliated to the university and offers 18 courses.

With a strict policy, biometric attendance was made compulsory for students and staff, and nearly 200 students were not allowed to appear for the exams for want of attendance last year. This he says, "Will help them learn and develop skills, also ensuring judicious use of fee reimbursements and scholarships."

Of late, the University has

been signing MoUs with institutes of varied academic disciplines. Currently, it has agreements with Jawaharlal Nehru Architecture and Fine Arts University, National Council of Rural Institutes and Potti Sreeramulu Telugu University at Hyderabad, NIPER at Mohali and the JNU, Delhi.

To coach students to practice and demonstrate skills in rural community, the University recently re-designed its curriculum to add a compulsory 'Rural Community Engagement' module for all the UG and PG students.

About 75 CCTVs on the campus, a new library with digitization facility, upgraded laboratory and sports equipment are added infrastructure.

However, at one point, the Vice-Chancellor begins to feel the pinch: Job placements, regular staff, and performance of engineering courses. "Job melas are being conducted and the numbers are on the rise, and I am awaiting sanction of regular appointees," he says.

"We have about 90 teachers, both permanent and academic consultants and I ensure no classroom is without a teacher," he affirms.

A gold medalist in Physics, Prof. Altaf Hussain from Atmakur mandal in Warangal has around 40 published research papers and three books in his more than three-decade career.

He completes his first year in the office and his report card by the students says, "The University certainly took a shape after he came," to which he says (smilingly), "Students are the best judges of teachers!"
