Her Excellency Governor **Dr.Tamilisai Soundararajan** Visit to MG University and she Unveiled the Gandhi Statute



Her Excellency, Governor Dr. Tamilisai Soundararajan visited the Mahatma Gandhi University. She unveiled Mahatma Gandhi's statue and participated in Bathukamma with the faculty, launched a mega blood donation camp and later, chaired the executive council meeting.

On this occasion Her Excellency, Governor Dr. Tamilisai Soundararajan emphasised on the need for quality in higher education. She stressed: "It is vital that our students get access to quality higher education to meet the global level competition".

The Governor addressed the executive council members, academic administrators and others at the Mahatma Gandhi University in Nalgonda. She called for creating academic and research facilities that could meet the global standards. She stated that in order to face the global competition, students must be trained in tune with the global benchmarks.

PECET-2021

TS PECET is a Physical Education Common Entrance Test which is conducted by Mahatma Gandhi University, Nalgonda on behalf of Telangana State Council of Higher Education (TSCHE). Candidates seeking admission into two years B.P.Ed and D.P.Ed programmes in the state of Telangana can appear. TS PECET is divided into two parts which are – Physical Efficiency Test and the Skill Test in the game.

The Physical Education Common Entrance Test under the auspices of Mahatma Gandhi University conducted peacefully across the state. Tests were conducted for the candidates in various sports in 14 centres across the state. Higher Education Council Chairman Professor Limbadri inaugurated the competition at the MGU main campus. After that, he introduced the aspirants from different areas and cheered them by throwing a shot put

himself. A total of 5054 candidates applied for physical events across the state, 3,133 candidates appeared in 14 examination centres. 1,921 candidates were absent. The competitions started from 7 am and were completed successfully following the Corona norms.
